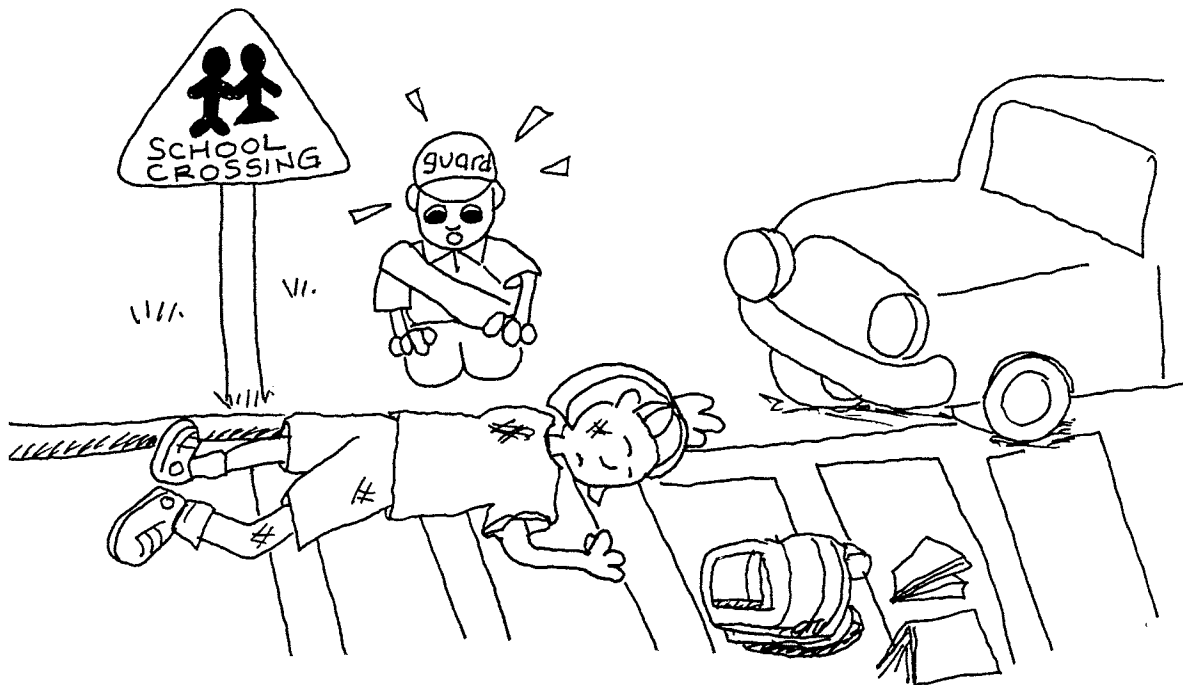

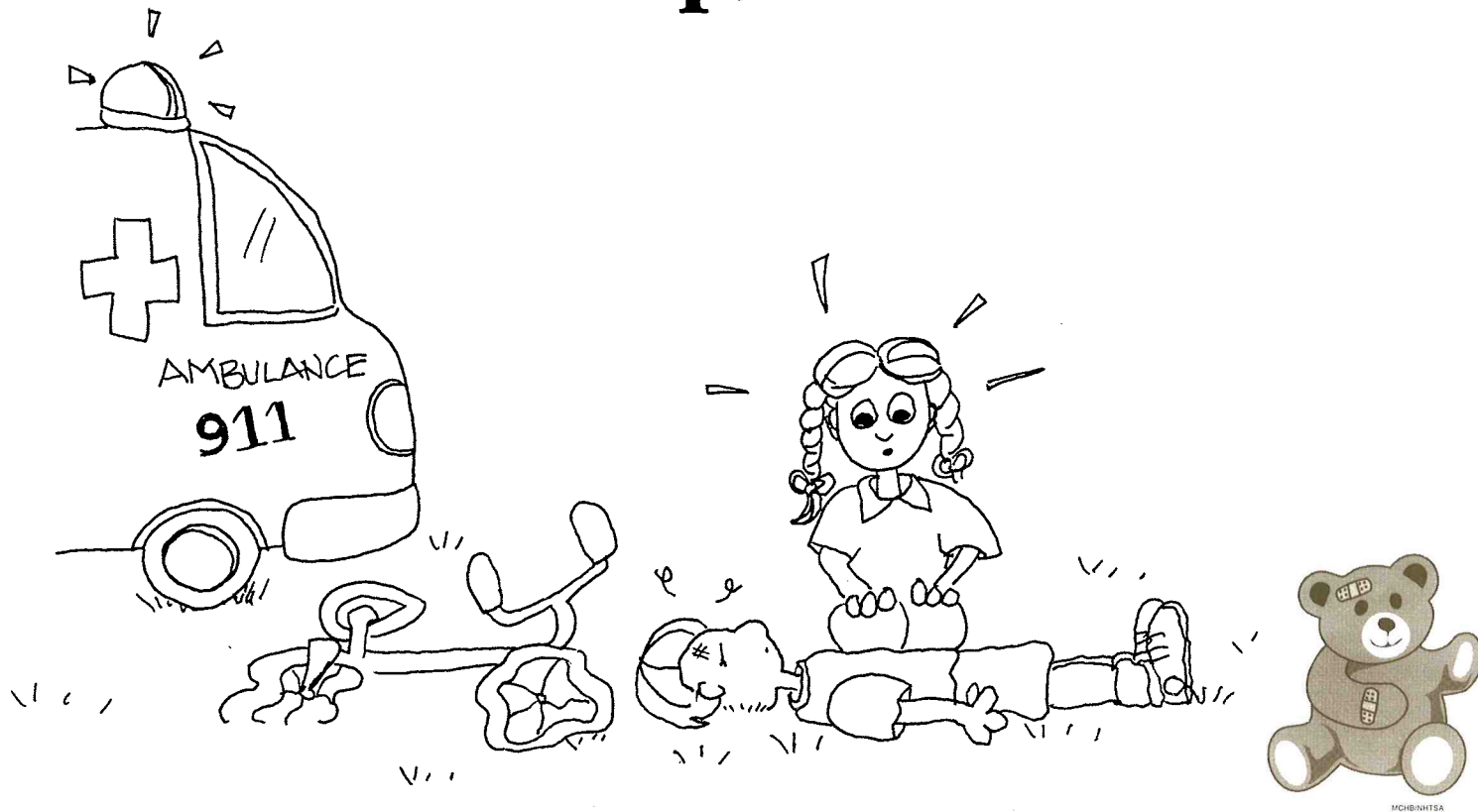
**It can be scary when

when you need help fast.**



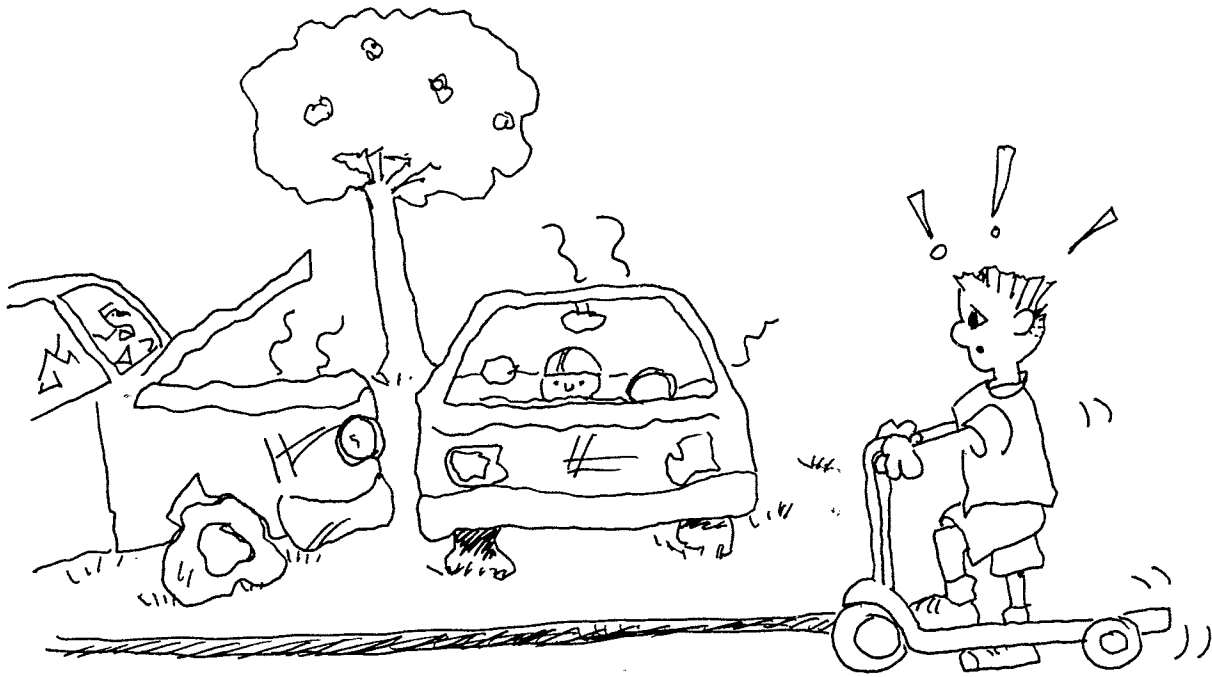
**If you see someone

and needs help, call 911.**



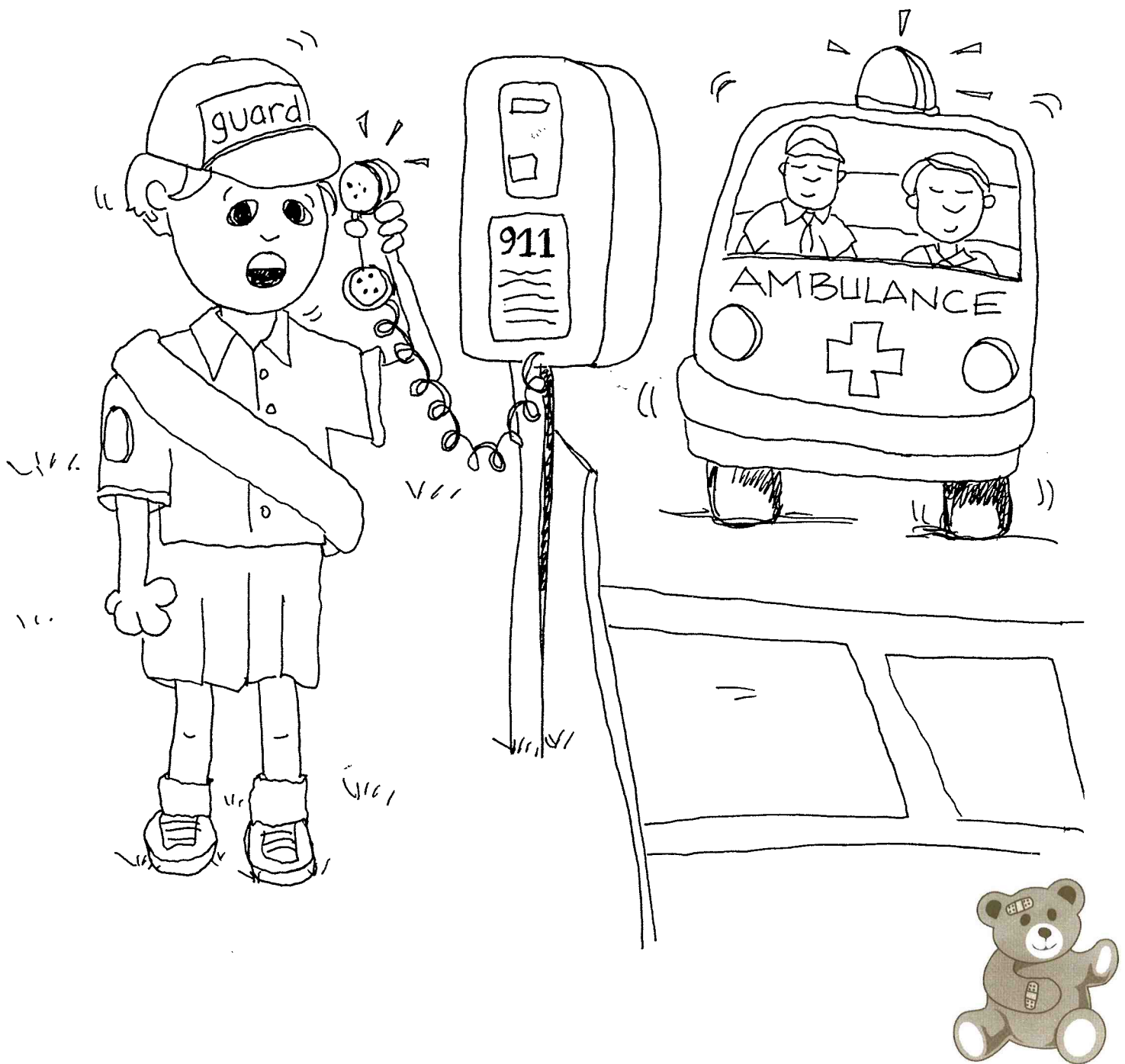
If you see a car crash, call 911.

What is your name?

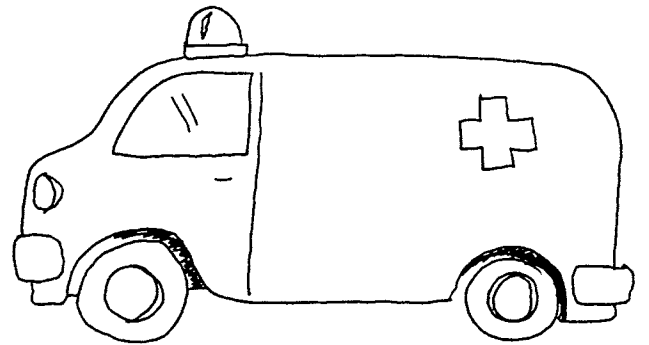
What is the address you are at now?

What is the phone number where you are at now?

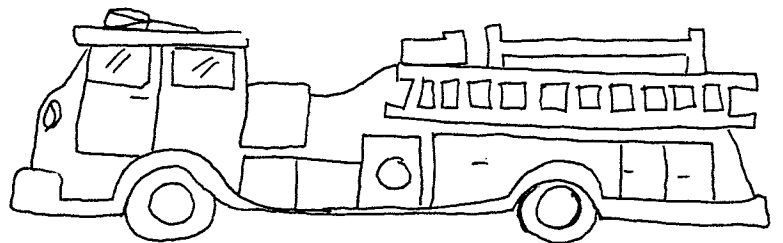


Match the 911 helpers by drawing a line to how they would come to help you.

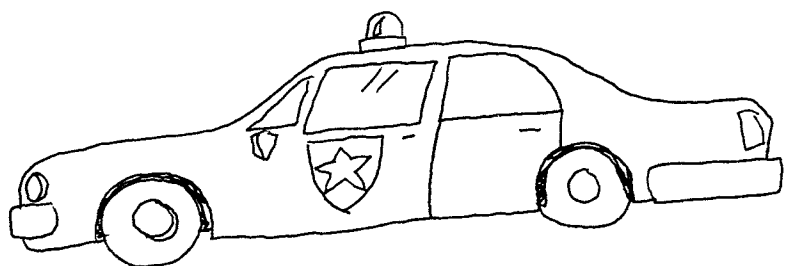

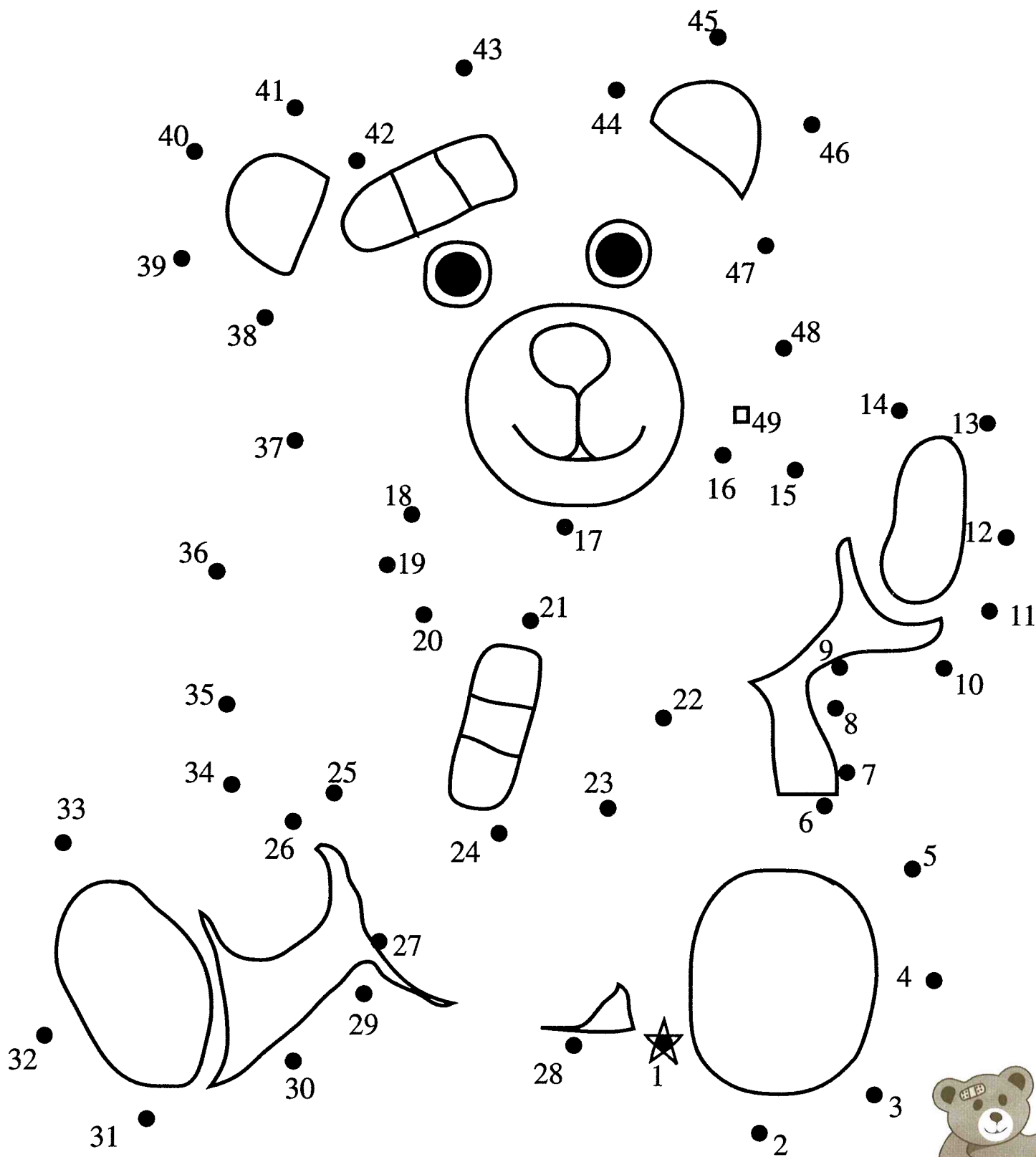

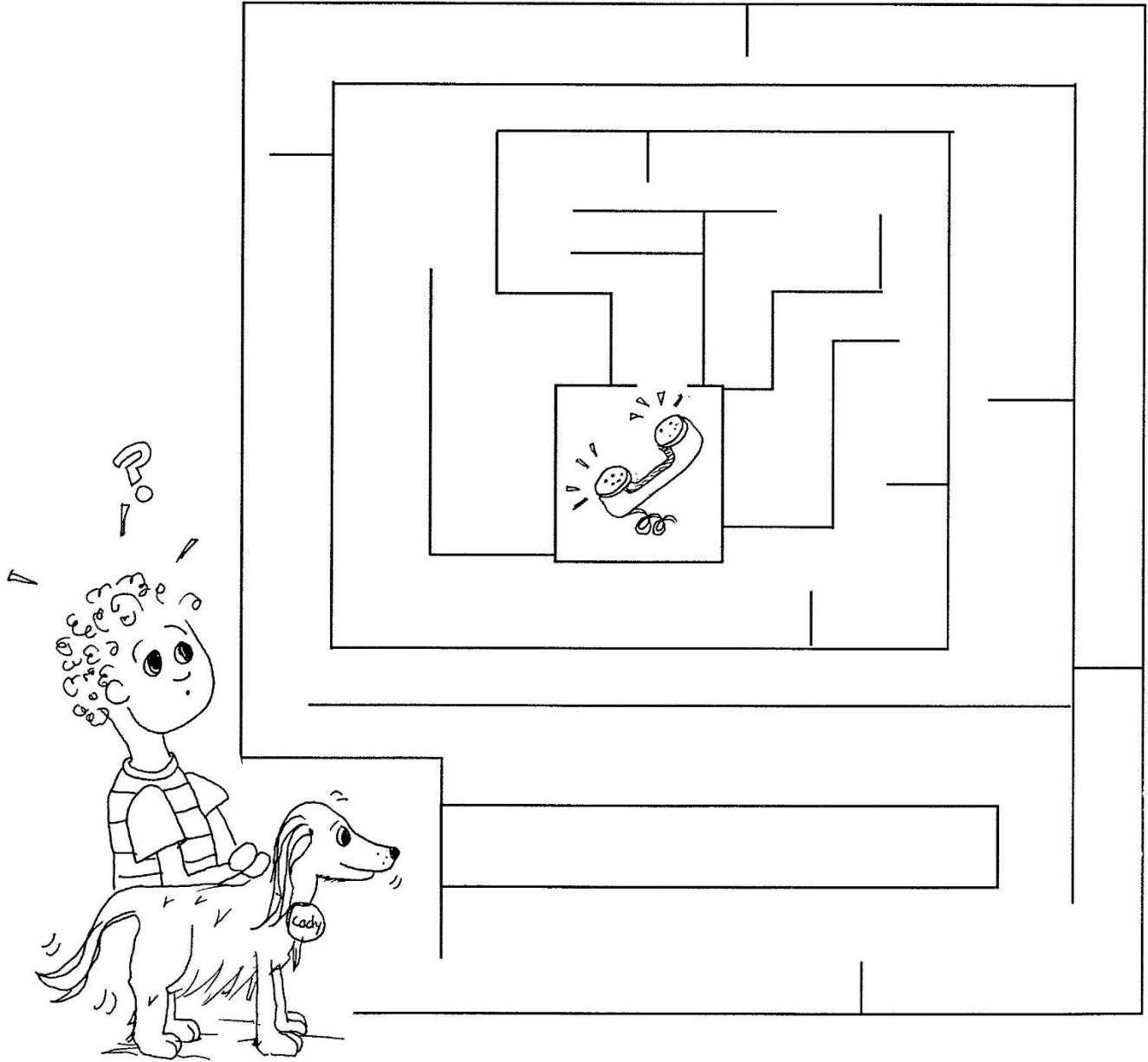
