

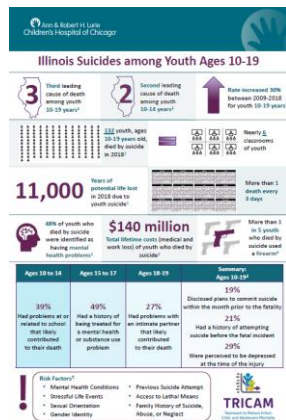


Local Resources for Comprehensive Suicide Prevention and Care

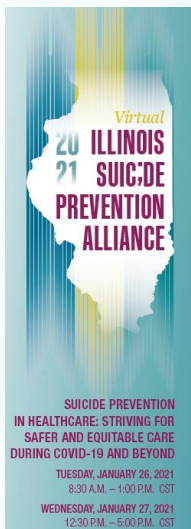
