Positive STEPS

Living with HIV? Between the ages of 16 and 29? Currently taking HIV medication? Feel like it's sometimes hard to take your medication on schedule?

If you said yes to all four, you may be eligible to take part in a research project called Positive STEPS, which aims to figure out ways to help young people better take their HIV medications.

YOU MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IF:

- > You are 16-29 years old
- > You are HIV-positive
- > You are taking medication for your HIV
- > You have reported difficulties taking all of your HIV medications on schedule (as prescribed) in the past month.

STUDY PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE UP TO \$310 COMPENSATION FOR THEIR TIME.
