### I. DuPage County Prevention Leadership Team (PLT)

Age Group: youth ≤18
Insurance: Not Applicable
Cost: Free of Charge

The DuPage County Prevention Leadership Team (PLT) came together in 2011 following a county-wide health assessment, which identified substance abuse/mental health use as two of the top five health priorities facing DuPage County. This information led to a call to action among community leaders and the PLT was created with the goal of reducing substance use and increasing mental health among DuPage County youth, 18 years and younger.

- o PLT Goals:
  - Reduce substance use among DuPage County youth, 18 and under
  - Increase mental health among DuPage County youth, 18 and under
  - Identify and advocate for environmental and policy changes that will lead to the reduction of vouth substance use
  - Increase awareness and access to services
- The coalition meets as a whole once a month. Additionally, four sub-committees including; data committee, policy committee, communications committee, and school committee, also meet once a month outside of regular coalition meetings to work on action items.

Age group: 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade *Insurance:* Not Required *Cost:* Free of Charge

- Group therapy model
- 6-8 weeks sessions (made up of 8-12 students)
  - Each session is 60-90 minutes
- Group is made up of a diverse mix of students (they're not all best friends)

#### **Grief Group**

Age group: 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade *Insurance:* Not Required *Cost:* Free of Charge

- o Postvention (after a student dies by suicide)
- 8-week support group
- Done in school-setting with a focus on those close to the person who died by suicide

# Signs of Suicide

Age group: 6th-12th grade Insurance: Not Required Cost: Free of Charge

- Signs of Suicide (SOS) is included in SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and **Practices** 
  - EM offers SOS in schools for 6-12<sup>th</sup> grades
  - EM supports all aspects of planning and logistics and offers SOS free of charge
- School implementing SOS also receive staff training, parent training, and community training (e.g. in faith-based settings)
- Parents receive a letter about SOS and must opt-out if they do not want their child to participate
- o The SOS program seeks to teach youth that depression is a treatable illness, empower them to respond to a potential suicide (themselves, a friend or a family member), and prevent teen suicide. These goals are accomplished through the **ACT** technique:
  - Acknowledge that you or a friend may be depressed or suicidal
  - Respond with Care
  - Tell a trusted adult
- SOS is a 40-60 minutes session that fits into one school period
  - At the end of the session, students complete a questionnaire including whether they are actively suicidal or know of a friend who is
  - Students who are identified as being high risk are given a Mental Health Risk Assessment and their parent is contacted
- EM works closely with Riveredge and Linden Oaks Behavioral Health Hospitals
  - Linden Oaks offers a consultation line that teachers can call if they feel a student is at risk
- EM works with school districts as well as on an individual school basis
  - EM has worked with all middle and high schools in Naperville
    - 36 schools in DuPage County have been trained on the SOS program including: Glenbard, Hinsdale, Naperville

The purpose of Impact DuPage is to create a common understanding of community needs, gaps and priorities that will advance the well-being of the DuPage County community. To achieve this, Impact DuPage will engage community stakeholders in a coordinated approach to ongoing community needs assessment, resulting in data-driven solutions to address county priorities, align resources, and improve population level outcomes.

- Behavioral Health has been identified as a 2019-2021 priority
- o Mission: Improve access and quality of behavioral health services for all DuPage County residents, advocate for aligning resources and funding, and educate the community about the signs and symptoms of mental health issues.

Age group: 7<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grade Insurance: Not Required Cost: Free of Charge

- Evidence-based, 50-minute mental health awareness program for high schools (9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> grade)
  - Teens learn how to recognize the early warning signs of mental illness and what to do if they or someone they know is exhibiting these signs
  - NAMI DuPage also offer a version for middle schools (7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> Grade)
  - In DuPage County, 17-18,000 students annually receive Ending the Silence
    - 23 high schools and 25 middle schools (half of all middle and high schools in the county)

- o Course includes: navigating the system, overview of treatment options, and social support



Age group: 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade Insurance: Not Required Cost: Free of Charge

- 6-week, support group for high school students with mental health issues (max 10 students)
- Co-lead by NAMI peer leader and a clinician (currently from Advocate Good Samaritan Hospital)
- Free of charge, teens can be referred by parents, provider, self-refer
- NAMI DuPage also offers postvention support to schools (after a student dies by suicide)

*Insurance:* Medicaid/MCO only Cost: Medicaid/MCO coverage

- DCHD serves as a community mental health provider
- Services: family, group and/or individual therapy (including mental health assessments and treatment plans), medication management and case management (Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist on staff)
- Residential Services: 200 beds throughout DuPage County including group homes, supervised apartments, long-term housing, and a 12-bed respite unit for short-term stays

- Through a grant from SAMSHA, DCHD has partnered with 6 hospital ERs in DuPage County (Central DuPage, Advocate Good Samaritan, Edward, Elmhurst, Adventist Medical Center Glen Oaks, and Adventist Medical Center Hinsdale)
  - If a hospital ER calls DCHD because an individual is at risk, but does not meet criteria for hospital admission, a Crisis Intervention Unit (CIU) team member will meet with the individual and connect them with services (Medicaid/MCO-> can receive behavioral health services at DCHD. Private insurance -> connected to resources offered by insurer)
    - If an individual is admitted, a DCHD counselor who participates in hospital rounds, will support discharge planning and make sure that services are in place once the person leaves the hospital
    - Anyone, regardless of age or insurance status is eligible for these services
    - This program was piloted at Central DuPage Hospital in 2016 and as of 5/31/19, has expanded to all six hospitals
- o DCHD's mobile crisis response team will meet an individual at risk wherever they are
- DCHD's CIU works with three local police departments, so if police encounter someone in psychological distress, they call the CIU, which sends a team member to assist on site
- Requests for mobile crisis response can be made to Crisis Services at 630-627-1700. Callers will need to provide:
  - Information regarding the nature of the crisis
  - Contact information for the individual in crisis
  - Location of the crisis

Age group: under 21 years of age Insurance: Medicaid/MCO only Cost: Medicaid/MCO coverage

- SASS is a state-funded program which supports minors who have Medicaid/MCO coverage and are determined to be at risk to themselves or others
- o Schools, hospitals, police departments, and families can all call the SASS hotline
- o If a call is made to SASS and the youth is determined to be at risk, a SASS worker is sent out
- o If a minor comes to the ER and they have Medicaid/MCO, the hospital must call SASS
- o The goal of SASS is to avoid hospitalization and provide a child with the services they need
- SASS is offered for up to 90 days, DCHD then connects the child with follow-up services
- DCHD has a close relationship with schools in DuPage County because SASS follow-up (during the 90 days) often occurs in the school setting
